JDC Review

- Mozambique Campaign More than 50 MPs had signed up & JDC were asking for permanent debt relief for Mozambique.
- The new Head of IMF had put the Debt Crisis at the top of their agenda.
- In 2019, 1 in 4 people were struggling with debt.
- JDC had managed to raise £50,000.

Fairtrade

- The FT Town Steering Group will meet on 29th January at 3.45 pm in the Civic Centre.
- FT Fortnight runs from 24th February to 8th March. Schools are being invited to participate in a story writing competition "She deserves a better story" on the theme of ensuring that all farmers (particularly women cocoa farmers in West Africa) are paid fairly for their work and are able to earn a living income. Presentation of awards for the winning entries will be in the Community Hub on 6th March.
- A decision on whether to have a Fairtrade stall in the Middleton Granger shopping centre had
 not been made. MG explained that it was difficult to arrange one this year due to personal
 circumstances & doubts about whether there would be sufficient volunteers to staff the stall.
